

Martha Kay Bakke July 11, 1948 - September 02, 2021

Martha Kay Bakke, 73, of Roland, passed away on Thursday, September 2, 2021, at the Israel Hospice House in Ames.

Martha Kay Bakke was born to Andrew and Veda Bakke on July 11th, 1948. Growing up, she enjoyed farm life and working with her dad. She graduated from Roland High School in 1966. After graduating from UNI in 3½ years, which included a 2½ month German study tour in Austria, she taught high school German and coached basketball and softball. She taught at both NESCO and Lincoln Central in Gruver, Ia. A favorite teaching memory: her students once placed her Opel (she owned two at different times- 'Odin' and 'Thor'!) sideways on the steps of the school.

In 1975, Martha returned home to farm after her father's death. She credits her neighbors and friends for helping and encouraging her as she took the reins of the family farm. During the winter months Martha worked at Anderson grocery store and Syngenta. She continued to farm for 40 years, retiring in 2015. She also volunteered at Mary Greeley Hospital and served on the boards of the Story County FSA, Key Coop, and the Roland Story Foundation.

Martha's life was defined by humble and faithful devotion to God, her family and her community. Over the years she served many roles at Salem Lutheran Church, including Choir Director for 28 years, Sunday School Superintendent, Trustee, Deacon, Women's Bible Study Leader, and Mistress of Ceremonies for many occasions. Martha enjoyed making people laugh and she was always available and willing to shower love on those around her. For her family, this was often in the form of kringla, chip cookies, lefsa, and Norwegian meatballs!

Martha also enjoyed puzzles (Sudoku!), reading, traveling (Austria and Norway were highlights), and annual fishing trips to Canada and Bemidji with friends.

She was preceded in death by her parents, her brother William, her sister Mary Ann Nass, and her great nephew Francis Nass. She is survived by her sister, Marcia Snider, seven nieces, one nephew, and 20 great nieces and nephews.
