

## Dolores L. Lounsberry December 09, 1928 - January 03, 2025

Dolores Lounsberry, Bethany Life, Story City, Iowa, aged 96, went to the waiting arms of her Savior on January 3, 2025. Born in Pembine, Wisconsin, in 1928 to Glenn and Ruth Mickelson Leach, Dolores lived a life filled with kindness, service, and quiet grace.

Dolores was a pillar of her family, church, and community. She and her husband, Richard "Ade" Lounsberry, were partners in every sense, farming and running their seed dealership in Roland, lowa, which became a beloved gathering spot for neighbors and friends. Popcorn and conversation were always on the house, a reflection of the generosity that defined their lives.

After a devastating house fire in 1964, Dolores and Ade experienced an overwhelming outpouring of community support, which shaped their enduring commitment to giving back. Dolores rarely complained about life's challenges, choosing instead to focus on gratitude and service. Her strong faith and cheerful spirit carried her through. Dolores devoted 30 years to teaching Sunday School, volunteered with many organizations, and lent her talents to numerous community projects. Whether helping her neighbors, cheering on her grandchildren, or simply serving with an open heart, she made everyone feel valued.

She is survived by her children: Rebecca (Tom) Thompson of Forest City, Iowa; Ruth (Mark) Randleman of Carlisle, Iowa; and David (Jeannette) Lounsberry of Lee's Summit, Missouri. She was a proud and devoted grandmother to nine grandchildren—Scott (Tisha), Seth (Josi), and Shaun (Emily) Thompson; Joe Randleman; Beth (Josh) Sloan; Jonathan (Brooke) Randleman; Sarah (Brian) Calcara; Nicole (Terry) Wise; and Eric Lounsberry (fiancée Emily)—and a greatgrandmother to 21 great-grandchildren. Dolores is also survived by her sister, Wanda (Lee) Borg of Des Moines, Iowa, extended family members, and numerous friends.

She was preceded in death by her beloved husband, Richard "Ade" Lounsberry; her parents, Glenn and Ruth Leach; her sister, Betty Lienemann; and two brothers, Tom and Dan Leach.

Visitation will be held at Soderstrum Funeral Home in Story City on Tuesday, January 7, with family present from 5:00-7:00 pm. A memorial service to celebrate Dolores's life will take place on Wednesday, January 8, 11:00 AM at CrossRoad Baptist Church in Ames, Iowa.


